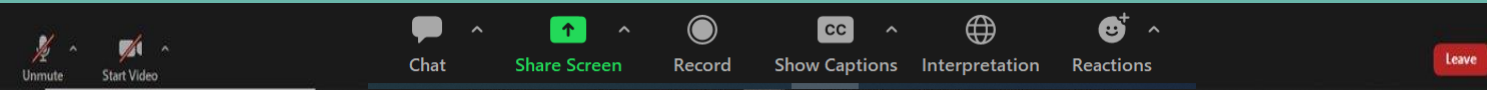

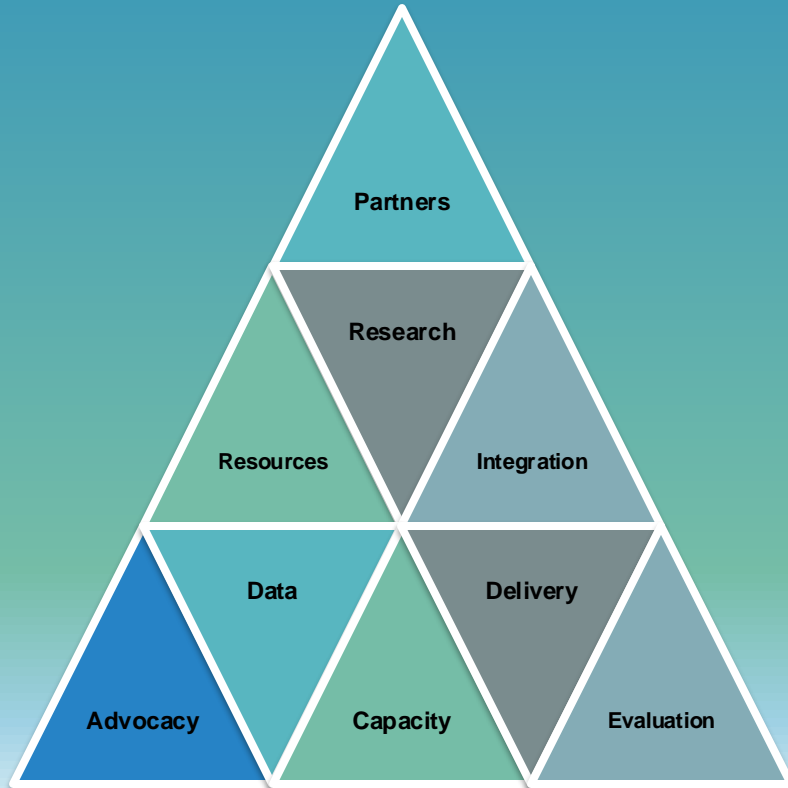

ICCP ECHO Approach: Implementation Strategies



- Improving data collection and use of data for NCCP implementation
- National coordination of cancer control efforts and partners
- Importance of costing, financing, and allocating resources for NCCPs
- Resource mobilization and advocacy
- Mobilizing the healthcare workforce, capacity building
- Use of data for monitoring, evaluation, and research
- Improving service delivery, implementing system changes

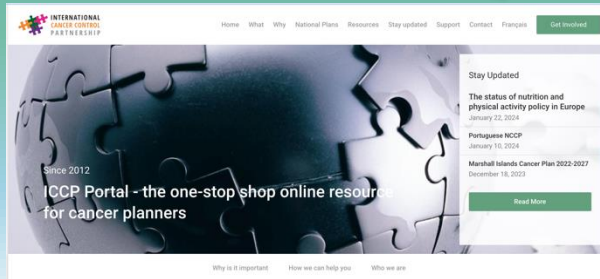
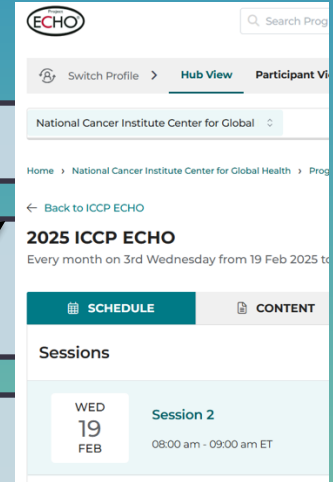

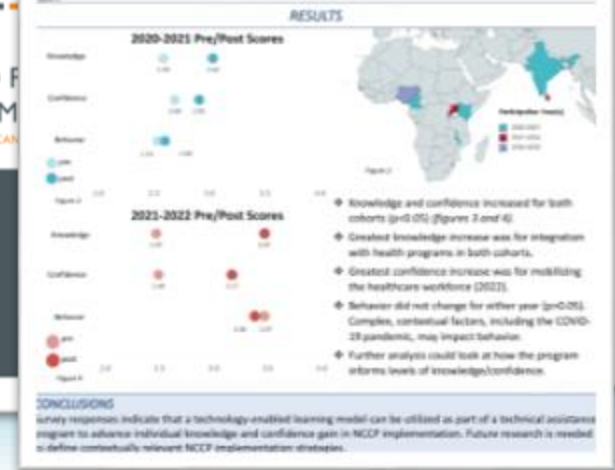


EVALUATING TWO YEARS OF A PROJECT ECHO VIRTUAL COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE TO SUPPORT NATIONAL CANCER CONTROL PLAN IMPLEMENTATION

BACKGROUND
The International Cancer Control Partnership (ICCP) ECHO is a technology-enabled collaborative learning model that brings together Ministry of Health-level teams in a novel technical assistance program that includes monthly, one-hour sessions focused around 12 implementation strategies (Figure 2) to foster knowledge exchange for low- and middle-income countries (LMIC) implementing NCCPs.

OBJECTIVE
To evaluate the first two years, 2020-2022, of the ICCP ECHO's effectiveness as a tool to facilitate knowledge exchange among LMICs implementing NCCPs.

METHODS
A pre-post survey measured changes in self-reported knowledge, confidence, and behaviors related to 12 evidence-based strategies for implementation of NCCP priorities identified by ICCP ECHO participants using a 4-point Likert scale. Comparisons were done using a paired T-test. 28 participants (88%) from 7 country teams responded to the pre-post survey during 2021, and 12 participants (54%) from 4 country teams responded during 2022 (Figure 2).

Why Prioritization Matters

- Selecting priorities and communicating them is a powerful tool to get national and community support
- Prioritization provides focus and direction amidst numerous cancer control needs and challenges
- It ensures that resources are allocated efficiently for maximum impact
- Engaging stakeholders ensures that priorities include diverse perspectives and needs

Implementation Priorities – Keys to Success

- Leverage existing programs and systems to maximize efforts, avoid duplication of efforts
- Identify high-impact areas of need
- Engage key partners in setting priorities to create shared ownership
- Anticipate potential challenges in implementation of priorities and plan to address them
